Warden's Message



The Life of Fr. Michael J. McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus

PRACTICAL VISION, ENDURING MISSION

With an eye toward leading others to heaven,

Father McGivney was attentive to the ways of the world as he worked to better the spiritual and temporal conditions of his immigrant parishioners. His innovative efforts to draw laypeople closer to Christ – especially through his founding of the fraternal Order of the Knights of Columbus – was creative, effective, and bold.

A priest who knew him well wrote:

Genial, approachable, of kindly disposition, cheerful under reverses, profoundly sympathetic with those upon whom had fallen the heavy hand of affliction, a man of strict probity and sterling integrity in his business transactions. He was charitable to a fault ... The poor found in him a good Samaritan and were the frequent recipients of his bounty. ... There are few clergymen in my recollection who enjoyed in a greater degree than he the respect of his colleagues and the reverence of the people. ... His energy was restless, ever seeking new outlets. And to this disposition are we indebted for the existence of the Knights of Columbus.

When he arrived for his first assignment at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, he met an ailing pastor who had to turn much of the pastoral work over to his new assistant. In a letter to his seminary mentor, he wrote that the whole work of the parish had been laid upon his shoulders and he had been unable to take even one day off. Seven years later, as pastor of St. Thomas Church in Thomaston, Father McGivney's workload only increased, with a mission church added to his duties. Falling ill during the global viral pandemic of 1889-90, Father McGivney developed tuberculosis and was forced to cut back on his routine to seek a cure. After months of heroic struggle against the illness, and after intense prayer for his parishioners and their future, he finally received the last rites and succumbed to pneumonia on Aug. 14, 1890, two days past his 38th birthday.

The funeral Mass and procession were attended by Knights and other Catholics from across Connecticut, and even secular news reports described him as an exemplary priest and a model Christian man.

Eleanor, Micah, Monico, Leo and Frances, to carry on his legacy of supporting one another and always leading with kindness. The family is indebted to the care they received from the healthcare professionals at LHSC and the compassion from the St. Joseph's Palliative Care team.




We will provide additional information as a plan of action is developed. In the meantime, we ask for your prayers and call upon the Holy Spirit for guidance.

London Food Bank Project – Thanksgiving 2023

Total donations city wide of actual food came to a grand total of 78,722 lbs.

I'd like to thank the Knights of Columbus volunteers for their faithfulness and enthusiasm as they encouraged shoppers to pick up donations for the

London Food Bank. As in the past, it made a substantial difference in increasing awareness of the drive and in nudging people towards that generous side in themselves. Your Council, volunteering at the Commissioners and Wonderland Food



Basics, generated a total of 448 bags. At 11 lbs per bag, that came to 4928 lbs of food. The conversion rate of \$3.12 per pound gives a total of \$15,375.36 worth of food donations.

40 Days for Life

London Right to Life organized the 40 Days for Life Prayer Vigil which began on September 27, 2023, and continued until November 5, 2023. The campaign involves dedicating an hour or two of your time to silently praying outside the premises of Victoria Hospital for the pre-born and their mothers, the most vulnerable, as well as those who provide or support abortions.



Since its inception in 2004, the global 40 Days for Life campaign has resulted in over 23,000 lives saved. St. John the Divine Parish was requested to cover October 24th which we accomplished with the support of our parishioners, some who prayed multiple hours. More support from our K of C

Council would have been welcomed.

The Columbian magazine has many articles written regarding the support that the Knights of Columbus provides for the Unborn Child including the March for Life, purchases of hundreds of ultrasound machines for pregnancy centres and the many activities carried out by local councils. I encourage our Brother Knight's to read these articles and to think about how you and we as a Council might become more involved in supporting the unborn.

I encourage you to consider these activities - March for Life which is held in Ottawa in early May of each year, the March for Life held in London usually around the end of September and the 40 Days for Life held in October/November each year.

The Fourth Annual Votive Mass in honor or Blessed Michael McGivney

The Fourth Annual Votive Mass in honor or Blessed Michael McGivney was held on Thursday, October



26, 2023, at St. John the Divine Parish. Mass was concelebrated with Fr. Kevin, Fr. Innocent and Deacon Ian Brennan present. Our choir director, Johanna Hurd, provided special hymns for the occasion.

Fr. Kevin delivered an eloquent homily on

Blessed Michael McGivney, a summary of which follows below.

Notes Based on the homily preached at the Votive Mass for Blessed Michael McGivney at St. John the Divine Parish by Fr. Kevin Beach on October 26,

2023.



With the Church today, we honour the memory and seek the intercession, of Blessed Michael McGivney, Founder of the Knights of Columbus. I have been a pastor in a parish where there is a Knights' Council and a pastor in a parish without a Council.

I can tell you that the presence of an active Council of the Knights of Columbus – as we have here and at St. John The Divine and St. George Parish –

makes a world of difference in the life of the parish community.

Today, the Knights of Columbus are among the largest, if not the largest, fraternal organization of Catholic men. Their numbers and impact in the Church, and in our society, are impressive. It is important to remember however, that the Knights were born out of necessity and in the face of adversity. At the end of the nineteenth century in the United States, there were strong currents of people who were anti-Catholic and anti-Irish.

In New England, including Connecticut where the Knights began, many of the Irish Catholic men, breadwinners of their families, were working in the mills where working conditions were harsh, even dangerous. Young families regularly lost husbands and fathers in industrial accidents and were left destitute without any kind of financial support.

At age 13, Blessed Michael personally experienced the loss of his own father. Out of pastoral concern for families, he saw the need for a fraternal organization of Catholic men whose principles of mutual assistance would look after families of members where the breadwinner died. This is an important point in understanding the founding inspiration of the Knights which guides them to this day. The Knights of Columbus are a fraternal



organization of Catholic men, but at the heart of who they are and what they do are Catholic families.

In a time when founding figures and principles are being called into question in our country and

in the United States, it is important to note the significance of Christopher Columbus whose name was given to the Knights.

Although he sailed to and made the European discovery of North America under the sponsorship of the Spanish monarchs, Ferdinand and Isabella, Columbus was an Italian. In the United States as part of the wave of new arrivals at the end of the nineteenth century, there was significant Italian immigration. In reaction, racist groups — notably the Ku Klux Klan — organized demonstrations and vandalism against several groups, including Italians and other Catholics. To counter this racist wave, American President Benjamin Harrison established Columbus Day, which was celebrated in the U.S. a few days ago, and which is a source of pride for Italian Americans to this day.

I want to add a final word on the nature of leadership in the Knights of Columbus. Blessed Michael McGivney ensured that the leadership of the Knights would be in the hands of lay men. Priests have always been members and serve the Knights as chaplains. Their role is spiritual. The leadership of the Knights of Columbus is by laymen, named and elected by their brothers. In many respects, Blessed Michael anticipated the call of the Second Vatican Council of the 1960's whereby our Church called laypeople to co-responsibility in the mission of our Church.

At this Votive Mass, we honour the memory of Blessed Michael McGivney and seek his intercession. We pray that his cause for canonization will receive God's blessing and the Church's favourable judgment at an early date. Blessed Michael, pray for us!

It was an impressive ceremony with representatives from all levels of government, City of London officials, and community groups participating. Prayers were offered by Chaplain, Rev. Frank Mantz, followed by the laying of wreaths.

The parade was led by the London Fire Fighters
Pipe Band marching to many familiar tunes —
Scotland the Brave, Marie's Wedding, The Road to
Dundee while encircling the village of Byron.
Traffic was at a standstill or diverted for an hour
until the completion of the ceremonies. A social
followed in the Legion hall to end a very pleasant
day.
