DEAR FAMILIES,

On Ash Wednesday, Christians began a 40-day journey of Lent. In imitation of Jesus who spent 40 days in the desert before beginning His public ministry (Mt 4:1-11), Christians took up traditional practices of increased prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (charity) to focus on all that Jesus has done for us and to ready ourselves to celebrate His resurrection from the dead at Easter. Our Christian faith does not make sense without Jesus' ultimate sacrifice on the cross, and conquering death through His resurrection. With this in mind, it is curious why resurrection sets – similar to nativity sets put out at Christmas – aren't more popular!

As our community continues our journey toward the cross this Holy Week, we hope that this Faith at Home Kit – Holy Week Edition will support young people in contemplating the Easter Story.

Here's how it works:

- Resurrection Kits will be available from Palm Sunday until Easter Sunday in the narthexes at both St. John the Divine Parish and St. George Parish. Pick one up for each young person in your household!
- Young people are encouraged to bring their Resurrection Kit booklet, as well as crayons or pencil crayons, to all liturgical celebrations this Holy Week. The schedule for Holy Week at

Springbank Catholic is available on the last page of this booklet. Young people can use these times of prayer to colour their kits.

- When all images have been coloured, assemble a Resurrection Set for your family. Cut out the images and glue each one onto its own paper towel tube (or make your own paper tubes by rolling paper and taping the ends together). The tomb will be glued onto an empty facial tissue box.
- Choose a place in your home to display your completed Resurrection Kit throughout the Easter Season, which concludes with the celebration of Pentecost on May 28.
- Consider re-telling Jesus' journey to the cross and the Easter story with you family's movable Resurrection Kit(s) throughout the Easter Season.

After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.


ANGELS



Do Not Be Afraid


RISEN JESUS
